

Peace Shepard Easton was born in Onslow County, North Carolina in 1975. She attended Swansboro High School from 1989-1993 where she excelled in volleyball, basketball, and track and field. She was a four-year starter for the volleyball team and was awarded the state tournament MVP when Swansboro won the State Championship in 1990. She was selected All-Conference and received the MVP Award three years.

As a track and field athlete she was selected as MVP three years. She was the Conference Champion in the high jump, triple jump and long jump all four years she participated. She was also part of the team's Conference Championship for three years. In 1991 she set the school record in the high jump. In 1992, she was part of the 4X400 relay team that won state, breaking a school record in the process.

Peace was a starter all four years for the basketball team. She was selected MVP three years, All-Conference four years, Conference All-Tournament Team three years, Conference Tournament MVP in 1990, and All-Region Team in 1993. She was named Carteret News Female Player of the Year in 1990. She was selected to play in the McDonald's East-West Game in 1993.

After high school she accepted a scholarship to play at North Carolina State, reaching the Final Four in 1998. After college, she played professionally overseas from 1998-2001. Since then, Peace has coached AAU and is currently the head coach at Holly Spring High School in Holly Springs, North Carolina.
